


Being Pushed for Room rent

Eating Water and Bananas

HUNGER RESCUE:: BUT FOR HOW LONG?

Hunger is the invisible enemy that people in India are fighting today. Many Rag pickers and sanitary workers because of lock down are starving for food and are living on bananas and water.

"I used to work from 7 am to 2 pm earlier and earn a side income by cleaning septic tanks in my neighbourhood. Now I work full time from 7 am to 6 pm. Even in my dreams, I am spraying disinfectant," says Manav (name changed), 26-year-old a sanitation worker with the Chennai Corporation.

Some of these people, do not have ration cards. The government gives them food only if they have ration cards. These are the vulnerable section of the society who have hunger crisis.

Hunger: The invisible enemy of the Blind: the Handicapped

The blind and the Handicapped people used to beg in the trains by singing and displaying their damaged body parts, and out of the money earned through begging, used to buy food and beat the enemy called Hunger. This was their lifestyle. Today there is no one to listen to their songs. They can't hear the sound of coins dropping into their collection vessels. Someone is telling them, "Get back into wherever you live. There is a new enemy who is ready to kill you, called the corona". Hunger is the arch enemy that they have always known and wants to kill them. They don't care about the new enemy right now.

The final Walk - Hunger strikes dead the 22 year old man

Little did he know that it was going to be the last walk of his life. As the 22-year-old was returning home to Tamil Nadu from another state far away, he died mid way in Hyderabad after walking for around 450 km. He was using available mode of transport, hitchhiking in trucks carrying essential goods. He was walking for nearly ten days and wanted to desperately return home due to national lockdown. They didn't have much money. He and his friends lived on limited resources of food and water. Finally his body could take it no longer and he fell unconscious and died.

How we operate & Help...

LAYERED HELP...

Since we are unable to go outside during lockdown, we simplify this process as much as possible. We transfer the money to the nearest central pastor or leader who then distributes it to the people in his area, one at a time. Since we are not allowed to gather and expected to maintain social distancing. We co-ordinate Action teams in differnt states across the country who sometimes buy groceries like Rice, Dhal, Flour, Oil, Soaps and Vegetables in bulk and distribuite them but if it is a remote part we do bank transfer.
